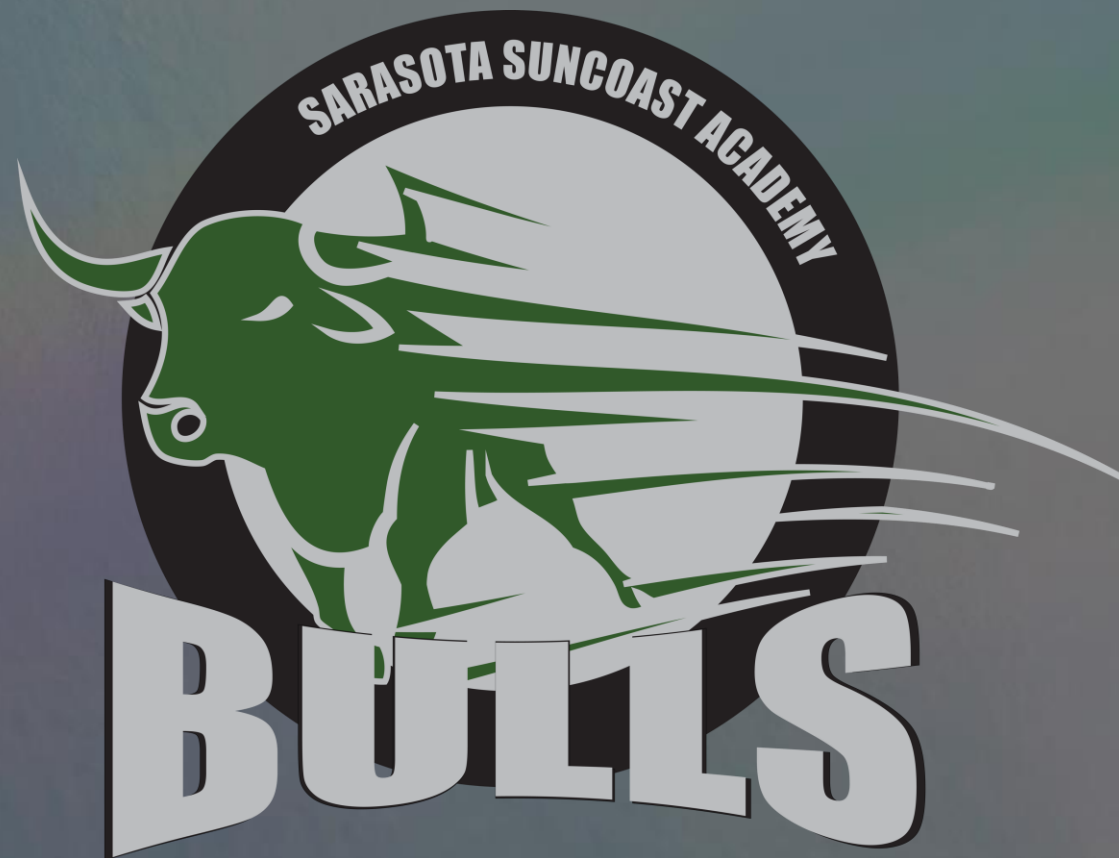

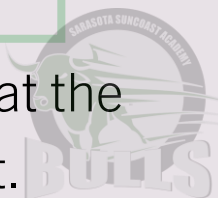
IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THIS HANDBOOK

The Student and Family Handbook has been developed to help students, families, and administrators understand the policies and procedures established for students. Topics of interest can be navigated using the menu on this page. Your school may have additional resources like a school-specific handbook that can be found on their website.

LUNCH



- Checks should be payable to “LAKEVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL” and should be placed in an envelope marked with your child’s name (& pin number if you know it.) Note: You can put any amount of money in your child’s account. It is not necessary to pay on a daily basis. Money can be added to your child’s lunch account online through www.myschoolbucks.com
- **Need Assistance?** Applications for Free & Reduced Lunch need to be completed and turned in to the district for approval. These items are confidential, and we are not informed, nor do we have any control of decisions they make. You can sign up online by going to sarasotacountyschools.net. Click on “popular links” at the top. Click “menus,” and the application is on the right.



LUNCH



- Middle grade students are allowed to purchase available seconds with parent permission
- If parents wish to eat school lunch with their child, they must let the office know first thing in the morning so that Lakeview can be notified to include additional lunches, and they must pay for lunch when they are served. Adult lunches are \$4.00.
- If a student is going to be tardy, be sure to call and let us know if they need lunch.
- Menus are sent home monthly. Students may eat school lunch or bring their own nutritional bag lunch from home. **NO SODAS OR CANDY PLEASE!**

Please Note: Cafeteria staff will not have time to microwave student lunches.



HEALTH INFORMATION

- If your child has allergies, asthma, or any other major health issues, please make sure you complete school paperwork so that we can take care of them properly. (A county health nurse may be contacting you to get further instructions on their care.)
- It is illegal for us to have **ANY** medication on school grounds without a written authorization from their doctor, including over the counter medications. Forms are available from the school office. **Note: It is also illegal for students to transport any medications. You must come to the front desk and sign in/out all medications.**
- Students may not come to school if they have a rash, pink eye, or active head lice. Students will be sent home with active head lice, if they have a fever of 100 degrees or higher, or if they vomit. Please make sure you have correct emergency numbers.
- *****SCHOOL POLICY: Students may not return to school until they have been fever/upset stomach free (without medication) for 24 hours.**



Attendance Policy

As we begin the school year, we would like to clarify all attendance policies at Suncoast Academy.

School begins **PROMPTLY** at 8:30 a.m.

It's advised that students are dropped off **NO LATER** than 8:20 a.m.

Students will begin "Advisory" at 8:30 a.m.

This is an important part of the Responsive Classroom day; therefore, it is important that your child be in class and ready to begin **BEFORE** 8:30 a.m. daily.

**** Drop off gate will be closing at 8:28 a.m.****

After this time parents will have to sign them in the main office.



Morning Drop-off

- Please do not drop off your child before 8:00 a.m.
Gates to campus will remain locked until that time.
(Before Care is \$12/day and runs from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 a.m.)
- Students arriving between 8:00 and 8:27 go to their grade level designated area. At **8:27**, students go to their advisory classroom.
- Students needing breakfast **must** arrive before 8:10 and go to cafeteria.

If you are late, please follow this procedure:

You MUST park, come inside and sign in your child.

The book is on the counter at the front desk.

If your child will be later than 9:00 a.m., please call if they will need lunch.

We call lunches in to Lakeview Elementary at 9:00am.

****NOTE:** If your child wishes to eat breakfast here in the morning, they should arrive **NO LATER** than 8:10 a.m. In order for them to finish and get to their class on time.



Absences Policy

- **BE ADVISED:** In accordance with the **parent contract** you signed, excessive tardiness directly affects your child's learning and is grounds for dismissal from the school.
- Students that are absent have **three (3)** days to bring in a note to have their absence excused. We do appreciate you calling to let us know that they will be out; however, for audit purposes we still must have a note for their files. Absences past three days requires a doctor note to be excused.



Excessive Absences/Tardies

Automated phone call for each absence



6 unexcused = meeting or call with school



A student that has 15 unexcused absences within 90 calendar days is considered a habitual truant under state law.



The student may be dealt with as a child in need of services under Chapter 39, Florida Statutes. In addition, the parent/guardian may be subject to criminal prosecution under Chapter 232, Florida Statutes. School Board Policy 5.40 grants authority to the principal to determine excused absences.



Late Pickup

Students must be picked up by 3:30 p.m.

Habitual late pick up will result in dismissal from Suncoast



Early Pickup

- Students need to stay in class through dismissal as learning takes place from the beginning to the end of the day.
- Please attempt to make appointments after school.
- **Middle school students must be signed out in the middle school office!**
- **Please send a note** if you know in advance that you will be taking your child early. It really disrupts the class if the teacher has to stop instruction.



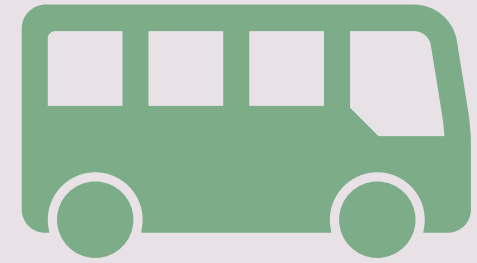
Bus Riders

Sign up for bus – Transportation (941-486-2141)

Bus riders must get off at the same stop every day they ride the bus.

Students may not ride the bus to go hang out at another student's house.

****Please note: Cars must yield to a bus at all times!**



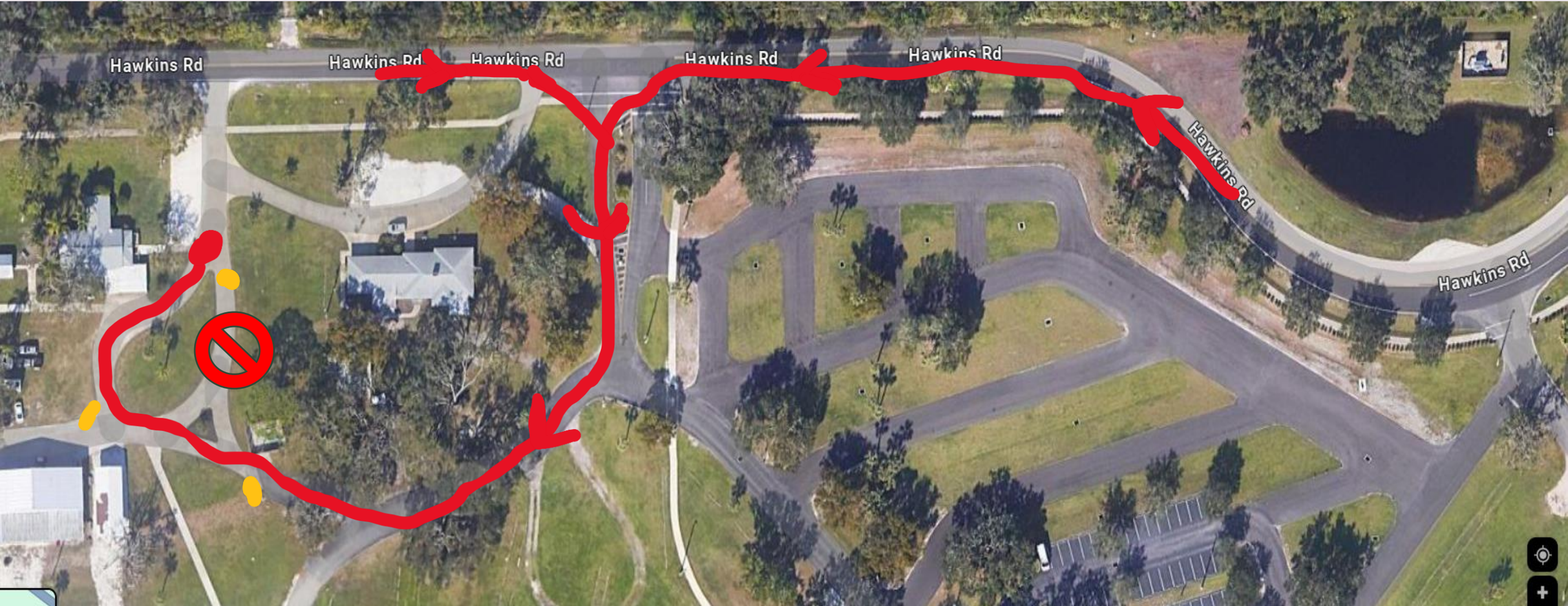
Afternoon Pickup

****Urgent Notice: Please Pull All the Way Forward****

- Pick up begins at 3:02
- Avoid early pick up. (Middle School pick up at MS office)
- Students will be walking out to find your car. Please stay in the car and do not walk up to where students are standing.
- Students with elementary siblings will be picked up by the big tree in the elementary line.



MIDDLE SCHOOL ARRIVAL ROUTE

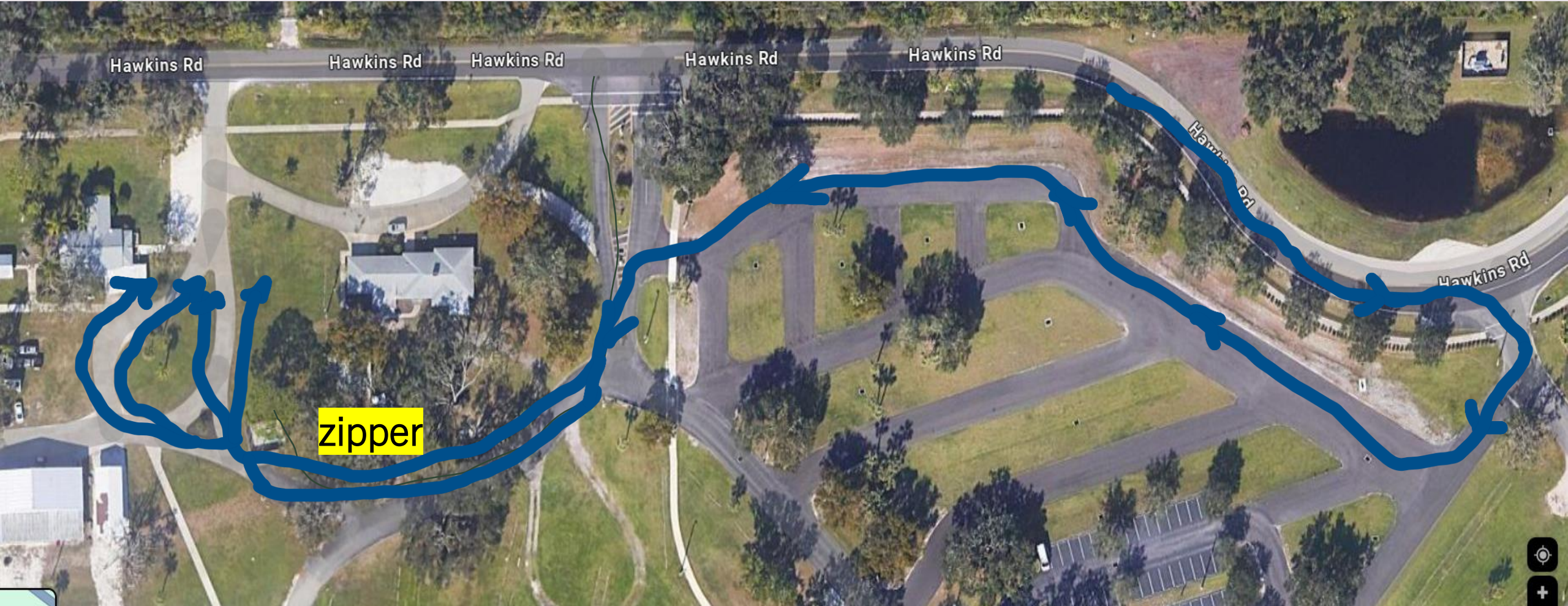


Arrival: Families With Multiple Students

- If you have a middle school student and Kindergarten or 1st Grade student, you will need to drop the middle school student off in the middle school car line and then proceed to the elementary car line to drop the Kindergarten or 1st Grade student off.
- If you have a middle school student and 2nd-5th student, they can all be dropped off in the middle school line as they are all portable students.

Dismissal: Families With Multiple Students

- If you ONLY have middle school students, they get picked up in the middle school car line.
- If you have ANY COMBINATION of middle school and elementary students, then you must use the elementary car line. Middle school students will be picked up near the tree, and then drivers proceed to pick up their elementary students



Uniforms

- Students are expected to wear school uniforms daily as outlined below:

Monday- Thursday

- **Polos:** green, grey, black. Any shade. Small logos
- **Bottoms:** At least fingertip length. Athletic shorts are acceptable. NO sweat pant material. No tights, leggings, yoga pants. Students may wear leggings under appropriate length clothing in school colors.
- **Shoes:** Closed toe shoes required. Crocs allowed when actively raining but must have change of shoes for when stops.
- **Hoodies:** grey, green, or black. No screen prints. Small chest logo is acceptable. Must wear polos under hoodie.
- A Children's World link will be provided on the website to purchase preselected items.

Fridays

- Students may wear their “School Spirit”, school sports team spirit shirts, or Running of the Bulls shirts on **Fridays Only** in place of their polo shirts.

CELL PHONE POLICY

We have adopted a NO-cell phone policy for the safety of our students, families and staff. We appreciate your cooperation in restricting the use of cell phones in the following areas:

- While in a car in the pick-up / drop-off line
- While driving in the driveway or parking lot at any time
- While walking in the parking area
- In the classrooms while students are present
- Parents should not text or call students on their cell phones.

Please use the school number for correspondence with students while at school.

This policy has been put into effect due to some close calls during arrival and dismissal in order to prevent accidents.



Student Cell Phone Policy



May have in their bags or purses, etc. (Not on their person)



Must remain OFF while on campus at all times



No smartwatches or other devices that can connect to internet



Students may **NOT** have Bluetooth headphones, must be headphones with wires



Students should not text or call from their cell phones during the school day

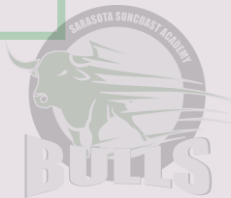
ACADEMICS AT SSA

- High academic standards exist at Suncoast.
- New this year: Any student receiving a letter grade of an F (59 and below) for a nine-week quarter will be placed on academic probation. The student will have one quarter to bring the grade above an F.
- Any students receiving an F grade will need to take Course Recovery for the next 9 weeks.

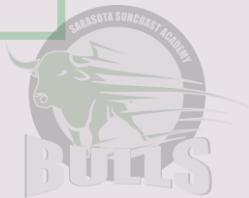
