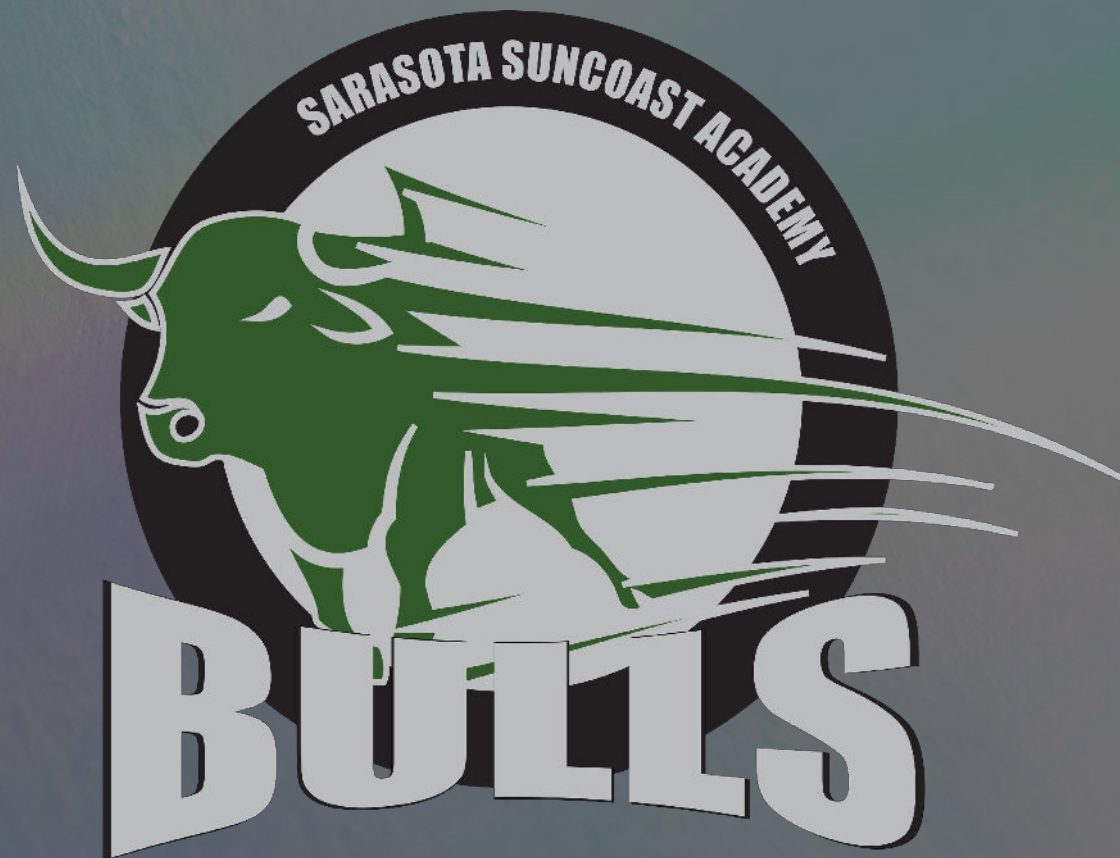

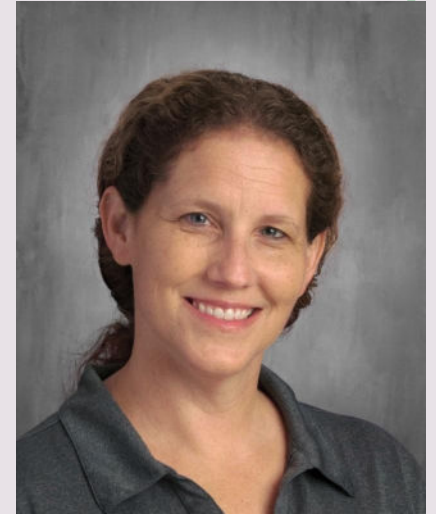

Lunches



Food for breakfast and lunch is transported from Skye Academy School on a daily basis. Lunch counts are called in before 9:00 a.m. each day. Please note the following:

- All checks should be payable to "Skye Academy School" and should be placed in an envelope marked with your child's name (pin number if you know it.) Note: You can put any amount of money in your child's account. It is not necessary to pay on a daily basis. You may put money in your child's lunchroom account online through Myschoolbucks.com.
- Middle school breakfast costs \$2.50 and lunch costs \$4.15.
- Middle Grade students are allowed to purchase seconds if available (funds must be available in the student's account)
- Per Sarasota County rules, students are only allowed 5 charges. After this time, they will be fed sandwiches until their account is settled.
- If parents wish to purchase school lunch, they must let the office know first thing in the morning so that Skye Ranch can be notified to include additional lunches. These must be paid for when they are served.
- If a student is going to be tardy, PLEASE call before 8:50 a.m. and let the office know if they will need lunch. Otherwise, we may run short on food.
- Students wishing to eat breakfast must arrive at school NO LATER THAN 8:10 a.m. in order for them to eat and get to class on time.
- Menus are available online at <https://sarasotacountyschools.nutrislice.com/>. Students may eat school lunch or bring their own nutritional bag lunch from home. **(No sodas or candy please!)**

HELP! We use parent volunteers in the lunchroom on a daily basis in order to provide our teachers with a much needed, thirty-minute lunch break. This mainly involves helping students open milk cartons and other items, wiping tables, and helping staff



HEALTH INFORMATION

It is illegal for us to have **ANY** medication on school grounds without a written authorization from their doctor. This includes all over the counter medications. Forms are available from Mrs. Hartley in the middle school office. **Please note: Students may NOT TRANSPORT any medications. It is illegal! You must come to the front desk and sign in/out all medications.**

- If your child has allergies, asthma, or any other major health issues, please be sure you complete school paperwork so that we can take care of them properly. (A county health nurse may be contacting you to get further instructions on their care.)
- Students may not come to school if they have a rash of any kind until the rash is gone or we have written permission from the doctor. There is a form that must be completed by their doctor before they can return to school.
- Students may not come to school if they have conjunctivitis (pink eye).

- Students will be sent home if they have active head lice. Please notify the office as soon as possible if you have found lice on your child. It happens and there is no need to be embarrassed. Good ways to minimize your child's risk of getting lice is: a) Keep girls' hair in ponytails, b) Use conditioners/gels on their hair, and c) Use blow dryers to dry their hair. If your child has lice, they must be treated and nits (eggs) must be removed. We need to check them in the office before they return to class. We make every effort to keep the school clear.
- Any student that has a fever of 100 degrees or higher or that vomits will be required to go home. Please make sure there are enough emergency numbers on their card in case they become ill.
- It is **school policy**, as outlined in the Parent Contract, that you keep students home if they are running a fever or have other symptoms that could infect their classmates. They **may not return to school until they have been fever/vomit free for 24 hours.** You may not give fever reducing medication and send them to school. This infects their classmates and our staff. This infects their classmates and our staff. We understand it is difficult for working parents to keep their children home; however, it could actually result in less sick days if everyone follows these guidelines.



Attendance Policy

As we begin the school year, we would like to clarify all attendance policies at Suncoast Academy.

School begins PROMPTLY at 8:30 a.m.

It's advised that students are dropped off NO LATER than 8:20 a.m.

Students will begin "Advisory" at 8:30 a.m.

This is an important part of the Responsive Classroom day; therefore, it is important that
your child be in class
and ready to begin BEFORE 8:30 a.m. daily.

**** Drop off gate will be closing at 8:28a.m.****

After this time parents will have to sign them in the main office.



Morning Drop-off

- Please do not drop off your child before 8:00 a.m.
- Gates to campus will remain locked until that time. (Before Care is \$12/day and runs from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 a.m.)
- Students arriving between 8:00 and 8:27 go to their grade level designated area. At 8:27, students go to their advisory classroom
- Students needing breakfast must arrive before 8:10 and go to the Cafeteria

If you are late, please follow this procedure:

You MUST park, come inside and sign in your child.
The book is on the counter at the front desk.

If your child will be later than 8:50 AM, please call
if they will need lunch.

Absences Policy

- **BE ADVISED:** In accordance with the parent contract you signed, excessive tardiness directly affects your child's learning and is grounds for dismissal from the school.
- Students that are absent have three (3) days to bring in a note to have their absence excused. We do appreciate you calling to let us know that they will be out; however, for audit purposes we still must have a note for their files. Absences past three days requires a doctor note to be excused.



Excessive Absences/Tardies

Automated phone call for each absence

5 unexcused = meeting or call with school

A student that has 15 unexcused absences within 90 calendar days is considered a habitual truant under state law.

The student may be dealt with as a child in need of services under Chapter 39, Florida Statutes. In addition, the parent/guardian may be subject to criminal prosecution under Chapter 232, Florida Statutes. School Board Policy 5.40 grants authority to the principal to determine excused absences.



Make Up Work Policy

To receive credit for missing work due to absence, a student must turn in assignments upon returning to school within the number of days missed. However, for assignments that had previously determined due dates, those due dates must be observed unless prior arrangements were made with the teacher.



Late Pickup

- Students must be picked up by 3:30 p.m.
- Habitual late pick up will result in dismissal from Suncoast
- Helpful Tip: If you sign up for *After Care*, we will send students over at 3:30 if you happen to be running late



Early Pickup

- Students need to stay in class through dismissal as learning takes place from the beginning to the end of the day.
- Please attempt to make appointments after school.
- Middle school students must be signed out in the middle school office!
- Please send a note if you know in advance that you will be taking your child early. It really disrupts the class if the teacher has to stop instruction.



Bus Riders

Sign up for bus - Focus Portal

Contact Transportation (941-486-2141) if you have issues.

Bus riders must get off at the same stop every day they ride the bus
Students may not ride the bus to go hang out at another student's house.

District Information: Parents can begin checking FOCUS for bus transportation starting July 22, 2025. If no information appears by August 1, they should submit a request through the Transportation page on the district website. The Wheres the Bus App will begin updating with route information on August 4.

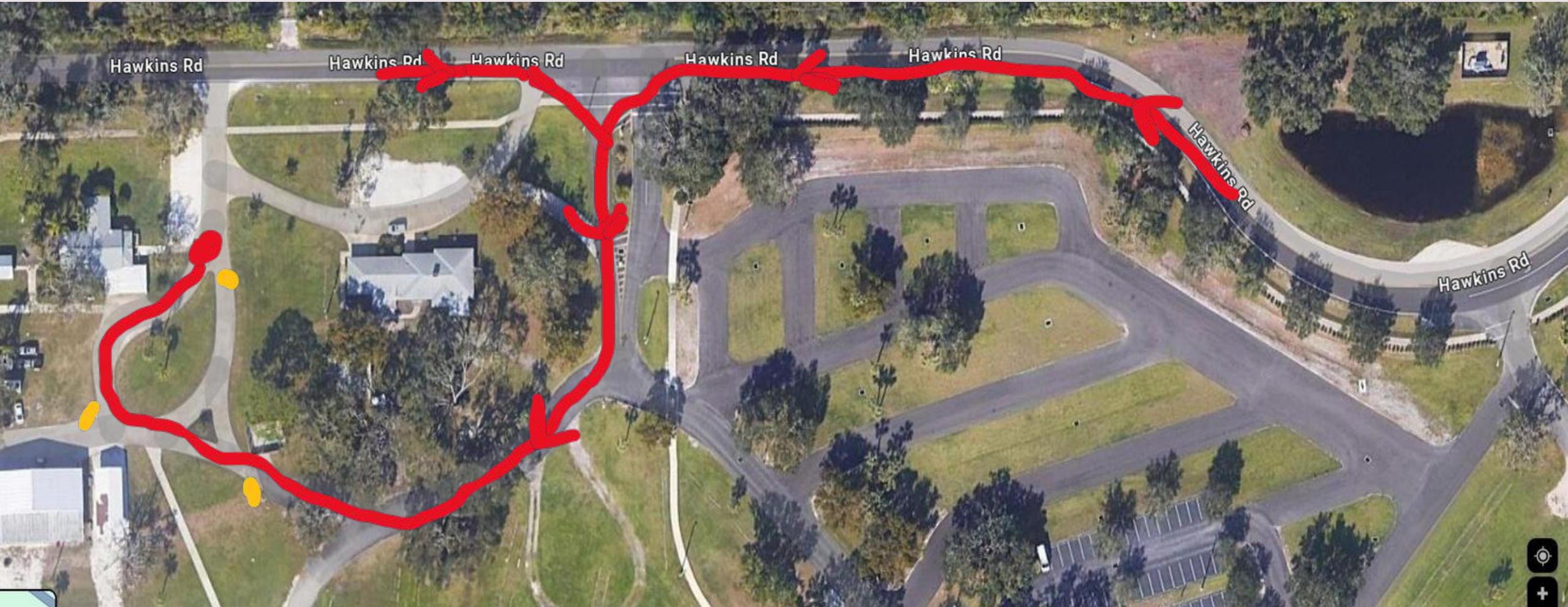
Afternoon Pickup

MIDDLE SCHOOL ARRIVAL ROUTE



Arrival: Families With Multiple Students

- If you have a middle school student and Kindergarten or 1st Grade student, you will need to drop the middle school student off in the middle school car line and then proceed to the elementary car line to drop the Kindergarten or 1st Grade student off.
- If you have a middle school student and 2nd-5th student, they can all be dropped off in the middle school line as they are all portable students.



Dismissal: Families With Multiple Students

- If you ONLY have middle school students, they get picked up in the middle school car line.
- If you have ANY COMBINATION of middle school and elementary students, then you must use the elementary car line. Middle school students will be picked up near the tree, and then drivers proceed to pick up their elementary students

PIKMYKID DISMISSAL APP

Elementary uses the dismissal app during dismissal, middle school does not.

Car Tag - Make sure to put name and Student PMK ID from pikmykid *3 digit number*

1. Download the app
2. Account is already made for primary contacts in FOCUS.
3. Child has been added to your account already.
4. Schedule pickup changes here - important.
5. Change Default Pickup - important.
6. We are NOT using the check in feature.
7. We are NOT using the announce your arrival.
8. Your child will have a unique ID - give that to the dismissal manager.



Uniforms

Students are expected to wear school uniforms daily as outlined below:

Monday- Thursday:

- Polos: green, grey, black (any shade). Small logos
- Bottoms: At least fingertip length. Athletic shorts are acceptable. NO sweat pant material. No tights, leggings, yoga pants. Students may wear leggings under appropriate length clothing in school colors.
- Shoes: Closed toe shoes required. Crocs allowed when actively raining but must have change of shoes for when stops.
- Hoodies: grey, green, or black. No screen prints. Small chest logo is acceptable. Must wear polos under hoodie.

Fridays:

- Students may wear their "School Spirit", school sports team spirit shirts, or Running of the Bulls shirts on Fridays only in place of their polo shirts.

ACADEMICS AT SSA

- High academic standards exist at Suncoast.
- Any student receiving a letter grade of an F (59 and below) for a nine-week quarter will be placed on academic probation. The student will have one quarter to bring the grade above an F.
- Any students receiving an F grade will need to take Course Recovery for the next 9 weeks.

Absent Work Policy

- For EXCUSED absences: To receive credit for missing work due to absence, a student must turn in assignments upon returning to school within the number of days missed. However, for assignments that had previously determined due dates, those due dates must be observed unless prior arrangements were made with the teacher.
- It is the STUDENT'S responsibility to check Google Classroom and/or the FOCUS portal for all assignments announcements, and assessments.
- Students must make arrangements with his/her teacher to take tests/quizzes that are missed within the policy time frame.
